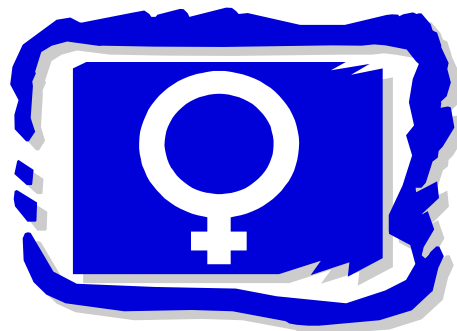
SPECIAL POINTS OF INTEREST

- Students must abide by all rules and policies according to the 2008-2009 Student/Parent Handbook
- All gum/eating and drinking fines-\$5.00. Students will be sent down to Mr. Ybarra's office.
- Detention may be given by any teacher. The student will serve the detention the following day the infraction occurs. How long will be at the discretion of the teacher. All detentions will be served after class.
- All dress fines-\$5.00 Students will be sent down to Mr. Ybarra's office.

Dress Code

Females:

Young ladies wearing any clothes that are suggestive, indecent or which cause distraction are not acceptable. Specifically tank-tops, T-shirts, halter tops, exposed backs or midriffs, short-shorts, mini skirts, and see through garments are not permitted. Jean pants are permitted. Walking shorts, jean shorts, skorts, over-all shorts, and skirts are permitted; however, should be no more than 3 inches above the knee.



Indecent/inappropriate patches, writings that are suggestive, or drawings on clothing are prohibited. Oversized clothing (more than one size greater than student size) is not to be worn to school. Specifically, "bagging" or "sagging" pants are not allowed. Cargo pants and shorts are allowed. Tennis shoes and dress sandals and slip-ons (**no flip-flops**) are permitted. Visible body piercing jewelry is prohibited except for traditional ear piercing. Oddly dyed or colored hair is prohibited

Consequences:

1st Infraction—\$5.00 2nd Infraction—\$5.00 fine and parents notified with student being sent home. 3rd Infraction—Parent and Assistant Principal conference.

Males:

Young men will wear collared shirts only. Uniform shirts such as Exxon, Pepsi, Taco-Cabana, and Military are not allowed. Shirts must be buttoned properly and worn tucked in. Graphics or logos on collared shirts that are suggestive or indecent or which cause distraction are not acceptable.

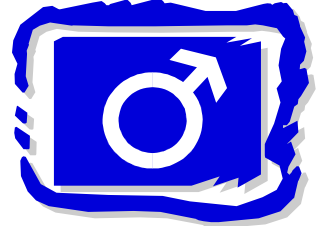
Students may wear regular style slacks, pants or jeans with a traditional cut. All pants must be hemmed accordingly and not torn up the seam. Oversized clothing (more than one size larger than student size) is not to be worn to school. Bagging and sagging pants are not allowed. Cargo pants and shorts may be worn. A belt must be worn with pants or shorts which have a belt loop.

Walking shorts are permitted. Gym shorts, basketball, soccer shorts, etc are not allowed. Tennis shoes and dress sandals (**no flip-flops**) are permitted.

Hair must be neat and clean. During the school day, student's hair is to be neat, clean and well groomed. Hair should not reach over the collar, cover over half the ear or fall below the eyebrows. Hair must be tapered and blended. Sideburns should be neatly groomed with no apparent design and not come below the bottom of the ear. The following is not acceptable: colored, bleached, dyed, spiked, bi-level, mushroom, dreadlocked, patterns, tails, corn-rowed or shaved heads. Beards, mustaches, ponytails and earrings, piercing (tongue) or facial jewelry are not permitted.

Consequences:

1st Infraction—\$5.00 fine. 2nd Infraction—\$5.00 fine and parents notified with student being sent home. 3rd Infraction—Parent/Assistant Principal conference



Absence

- Students are not allowed more than two absences for a one year course and one absence for a semester course .
- **Students will be referred to Mr. Ybarra after absences are exhausted.**
- Teachers are responsible for their class attendance.

Behavior That Will Be Handled By Teacher Before Involving An Administrator

- Excessive talking
- Eating gum or candy/drinking in class (Sent to office to pay fine only)
- Not working/Poor working habits/inattention
- Rude comments
- Scribbling on desk
- Any distraction or minimal disruptive behavior

Behavior That Will Be Referred To An Administrator

- Habitual tardiness/truancy
- Persistent disruptions
- Cheating
- Violent behavior and/or threats
- Deliberate profanity
- Substance abuse
- Weapons
- Vandalism
