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**Overview:** The second year of Army JROTC instruction will prepare the cadet to become a good leader within his unit. Emphasis is placed on personal accomplishment and performance of leadership tasks assigned by the instructors or senior cadets. Subjects of study will include, but are not limited to: Leadership, Techniques of Communication, Citizenship, Drug Abuse Prevention, Map Reading, Physical Fitness and Career Opportunities. Leadership philosophy and skills are taught in the classroom and put into practice during Leadership Lab sessions, which consists primarily of activities involving Drill and Ceremonies conducted in accordance with the Army directives.

All cadets will continue to develop the Cadet Portfolio they started last year. **This portfolio will assist the cadet in preparing college and scholarship applications.** See the directive on the Portfolio for more information. The portfolio will be evaluated each quarter and the grade will be scored as a quiz grade.

Since this course primarily fosters leadership development to make a stronger citizen, it is imperative the cadet stays abreast of current events. Add to his knowledge of key issues facing our society and culture by reading newspapers, reputable magazines, informational Internet sites and watching television news. The cadet should use this knowledge along with the leadership philosophy and traits taught and practiced in JROTC to hone his critical thinking skills. These skills and talents will be important in his personal efforts to achieve his own maximum level of performance in all phases of his life: spiritual, intellectual and physical.

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Cadets who are absent for a test or quiz must see me the first class day they are back in school to schedule a day and time to take the makeup test. If you fail to do this, you will receive a grade of zero for that quiz or test.

**Assignments:** Assignments not submitted on the date due will be accepted on the next class day with a 30% penalty. After that, a grade of zero will be assigned. If the student is absent, the assignment is due on the first class day they return to school.

**Magis Period:** Events scheduled during Magis period will normally be graded in this area. Students who are absent for Magis period events will earn a zero grade.

Cadets may earn a Citizenship 2 Certificate which will be annotated on their transcript. Cadets who achieve this Certificate will be awarded 5 points added to their semester grade, each semester. See the directive on the Certificate for more information. Cadets must participate in Extra Curricular activities to earn the Certificate. These include: (JROTC teams), Assist issuing uniforms, Battle of Flowers Parade, Fiesta Parking, Raffle tickets, Color Guard presentations, Oyster Bake activities, etc. Cadets who exceed the extra-curricular requirements will receive extra points in that semester, as determined by the AI. Cadets participating in any public event must reflect the standards of the school and the JROTC program, (conduct and appearance) otherwise he may not receive credit for participation.

Performance is evaluated continuously; attention will be given to conduct during classroom and outside activities as well as general conduct in the school.

Uniform inspections will normally be conducted weekly on assigned uniform days. Each uniform violation will be assessed 5 points; missing major uniform items will be assessed 20 points. 5 points will also be assessed for each instance of breach of discipline during military formations. A grade of less than 80 will require that the cadet be present on the following Friday for Detention Lab after school.

In case of excused absences, students may turn in assignments that were due on the day absent when they attend next ROTC class. If the day absent was a uniform day, they may makeup the uniform grade by wearing it on the next ROTC class day they are present.

Cadets and parents are encouraged to read and become familiar with the “Cadet Regulation” handbook.
